

Digital Schools Award





We are absolutely delighted to be awarded Digital Schools status. Digital Schools Awards is a national awards scheme to promote, recognise and encourage a whole school approach to the use of digital technology in schools. Following a rigorous internal self-evaluation process measured against set criteria lasting over an eighteen month period, Mr Shields submitted a detailed portfolio of evidence for scrutiny. An external validator reviewed this documentation and then followed up with a meeting to discuss and ask a series of questions to teachers, pupils and senior leadership. We had to wait a few more weeks for official confirmation but it was jubilation all around on receiving the welcome news. Needless to say, this is testament to all the hard work, commitment and dedication of all our school staff over many years to continually develop and evolve digital teaching and learning opportunities for all our pupils so that they may acquire the necessary skills and building blocks to live and succeed in these fast paced and ever changing technological age.

Below is a summary from the full report which can be viewed on the school website.

"The evidence from the validation discussion confirms that St Joseph's Primary School have created an engaging and highly effective digital technology deployment into their school's Teaching and Learning delivery across the breadth of their curriculum. Therefore, I am pleased to recommend them for a Digital Schools Award."

The 'Preparing for Change Program' focuses on 3 main elements that will educate, empower and support primary seven pupils and their parents/carers for the changes that they will face in the years ahead.

- **1. Changing Schools:** Building Resilience and Growth Mind-set at times of Change.
- **2. Changing Bodies:** Understanding the changes that take place physically and emotionally.
- **3.** Changing Friendships: Building Healthy Relationships, Healthy Communications, and understanding the power of our words and actions. Before launch, Mrs Garvey organised a very successful P7 parent information evening with extremely positive feedback.



Primary 3 – 7 GL Assessments

We will be carrying out our end of year digital assessments, Progress Tests in English (PTE) & Progress Tests in Maths (PTM) over two weeks beginning 13th May. It is very important that all children are in attendance as these assessments are primarily used for;

- Highlight strengths and gaps in core subjects of Literacy & Numeracy
 - Reveal barriers to learning
- Identify and support children with additional educational needs
 - Provide evidence of progress
- Deliver evidence of whole school improvement
- Directly inform teaching strategies
- Benchmarking and target setting
